The meaning of the ritual of using ashes

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Happy Season of Lent. I am sure you are thinking how could Lent be a happy season, right? Lent is a happy season because we spend time reflecting, introspecting, and waiting to celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ as living saints.

I have been praying and wondering what I would like to share with you as this very special season begins. In our chaplain gatherings, we have many discussions about Ash Wednesday. The chaplains come from different denominations. Some of them expressed they do not know the significance of Ash Wednesday.

Often, many people ask if there is a Biblical significance of the ashes. Therefore, I decided to share with you the significance of ashes and Ash Wednesday.

Ashes in ancient times were used to express grief and sorrow for sins. In Job 42: 3-, Job said to God: "Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes." The prophet Jeremiah called for repentance by saying: "O daughter of my people, gird on sackcloth, roll in the ashes" (Jeremiah 6:26).

The prophet Daniel recounted pleading to God: "I turned to the Lord God, pleading in earnest prayer, with fasting, sackcloth and ashes" (Daniel 9:3)

Jesus is quoted as speaking of the practice in Matthew 11:21 and Luke



you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago (sitting) in sackcloth and ashes."

We hear from these texts, ashes represent repentance, fasting, and prayer.

Have you heard about ashes to go? Since 2007, some members of major Christian Churches in the United States, including Anglicans, Catholics, Lutherans, and Methodists, have participated in 'Ashes to Go' activities, in which clergy go outside of their churches to public places, to distribute ashes to passers-by.

All these things make me ponder, what does it mean for us believers in Christ to participate in the ritual of using ashes? Is it just an external sign of repentance? Or are we truly

repentant? What are we repentant about? Are we willing to witness Christ as the bold women of the ELCA, empowered by the Holy Spirit when people ask the significance of the ashes when they see the sign of the cross on our foreheads?

My dear sisters in Christ, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust, you shall return."

We also are reminded of Diane Butler Bass's words. "The journey to Easter is not a mournful denial of our humanity. Rather, Lent embraces our

humanity – our deepest fears, our doubts, our mistakes and sins, our grief, and our pain. Lent is also about joy, self-discovery, connecting with others, and doing justice.

Lent is not morbid church services. It is about being fully human and knowing God's presence in the crosshairs of blessing and bane. And it is about waiting, waiting in those crosshairs, for resurrection."

I hope you agree with me Lent indeed is a happy season. Happy Season of Lent dear sisters!

Oh, Lord open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise. Psalm 51:15


I learned this simple verse as a small girl in Sunday School. Little did I know that this would be a life-long prayer encouraging me to tell my story and proclaim God's praise.

33rd CSS Women of ELCA Convention – August 7 - 9

The 33rd CSS W/ELCA Convention will be August 7-9 in Kansas City, MO.

This year's theme is "My Story, Your Story, Our Story" and the selected Bible verse is Psalm 51:15.

The convention and lodging will be at Best Western Premier Hotel. Lodging cost will be \$98.15 which includes breakfast. Call 1-800-528-1234 to make reservations before July 3. State that **you are with the Central States Synod Women of the ELCA,** (not welkah).

The 2020 convention registration information packets will be mailed soon. Full Registration cost is \$70. Cluster Coordinators get a \$10 discount.

Voting Members need to register by June 1. Participants have until June 15. Everyone, including officers and board members, must complete a registration form. The registrar must have an accurate number of attendees for churchwide report; meal count; choir music folders; and, quantity of literature needed for various activities.

Shared stories can save lives -- Kathy Steinke, board member

Maybe it's just me, but I respond most passionately to social injustice when I hear stories of those who have lived through hardship and pain. Survivor Annika Huff was accosted at a bus stop only miles from her aunt's and uncle's house. She was then drugged, beaten and trafficked for the next few years. Her story is powerful. Stories likes hers can connect people who are miles apart - geographically and emotionally.

Kansas and Missouri of the Central States Synod are tied together by 654 miles of Interstate 70 that runs across the two states. This major four-lane highway is a favorite thoroughfare used by abusers to transport their victims. I urge you to visit the website: trucker-sagainsttrafficking.org/videos and listen to real stories from women who were saved from human trafficking through the mission and work of that organization. There also are stories from bus drivers and law enforcement personnel who have helped save lives.

Learn how you can help spot victims and support the goals of Truckers Against Trafficking. Engage in ministry and action!

Crochet a prayer square, bring to convention

Crochet hook: H, (size G or F makes smaller size)

Make a slip knot.

Chain 5 & join

Chain 2 (counts as first double crochet)

Work 2 more dc in center of ring.

Chain 2 for corner space. Then 3 dc into ring Repeat steps from * to * 2 more times

Ch 2 for corner

Slip stitch to join to the beginning of round You should have a total of 12 dc st all together in this round counting the first chain 3 as one of the double crochet stitches.

ROUND 2

Slip stitch over to corner ch 2 space Chain 2 (counts as first double crochet) 2 dc, ch 2 for corner space, 3 dc in same space. [Ch 1, 3 dc, ch 2, 3 dc in corner space]
Repeat sequence 2 more times.

Slip stitch to join the beginning of round. You should have 24 dc stitches.

ROUND 3

Slip stitch to the chain 2 corner
Chain 2 (counts as first double crochet)
2 dc, ch 2 for corner space, 3 dc in same space
[*ch 1, 3 dc in chain 1 space below. Then ch 1*, 2
dc, ch 2, 3 dc in next ch 2 space)
Repeat sequence in brackets 2 more times and
then repeat from * to * once, then ch 1 to join to
beginning dc for a total of 36 double crochets.
Tie off, weave in the ends.

For a larger square, add a round 4.
